Didn't they do well; little stars of the future. Thank you to Marlene for sending these photos in; you and your team are doing a great job with these youngsters.



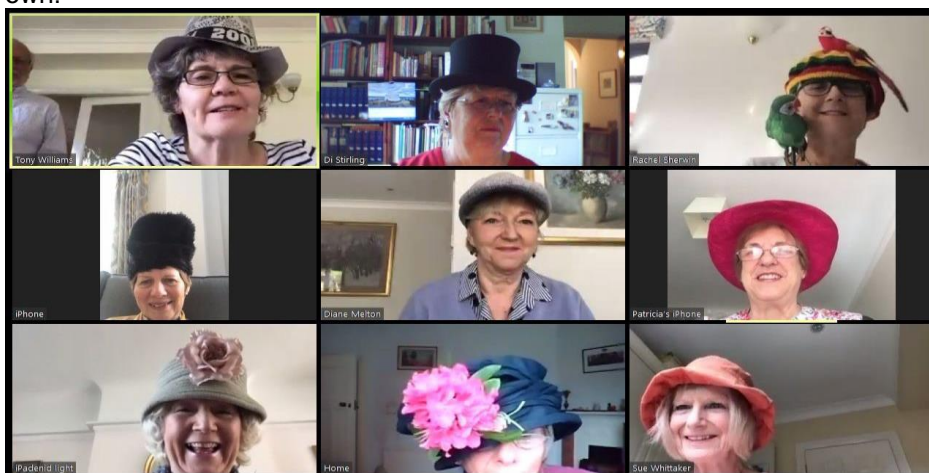
ASHTEAD FLOWER ARRANGEMENT GROUP:

So, what has AFAG been doing since then? Well like the Windmill "we never closed" apart from simply corresponding by email for a couple of weeks until we began Zooming. Once we had got to grips with Zoom there was no stopping us!
